Dolly Salazar Development/ Operations Manager It's been over twelve years since Mona Meeker first jumped headlong into the sea of history from which sprang San Juan Island. What began as a newcomer's fascination with the lore of her adopted home morphed into two years of hard slog, hours of intensive training, millions of words transcribed: The Oral History Project at the San Juan Historical Museum.

After attending a talk given by the late Beryl Wade, Mona, a retired school librarian, found her curiosity piqued. Knowing little about capturing personal histories, Mona nevertheless approached this museum's board with the idea of coordinating an oral history project for the museum. Lucky for us all, they agreed.

Mona and her crew of 11 volunteer interviewers (all of whom attended training workshops and lectures) produced an extraordinary collection of 32 personal histories of members of some of the island's pioneer families, all recorded on audiotape, some on video as well, with photographs, family lineages, charts, and summary indices included. It is quite a handsome feather in the Museum's cap — a beautiful tapestry of island life — and is used frequently by islanders and off-islanders to

research their own family stories. A great gift borne of one lady's affection for our past.

So, that's it, right? Work complete, project over? Of course not. This new millennium is nothing if not a digital dawn. And, being a historical museum, we *are* in the habit of preserving things.

Enter Vikky Dauciunus.

A recent escapee from corporate America, Vikky now devotes herself to her true passion: preserving people's stories. As a member of the Association of Personal Historians and founder of Vikkyd Productions in Friday Harbor, she produces video tributes, scrapbooks and memoirs of family histories and experiences. "Every life is a story worth telling, and is part of a history worthy of reflection," she says.

Well, as luck would have it, fortune smiled, the stars aligned, and Destry rode again: Mona and Vikky were introduced at the Museum's Autumn Auction last fall. And boy, did they have a lot to talk about. Let's just call it "great minds thinking alike."

Already familiar with the Museum through her friendships with Museum staff, and now with Mona as her point person, Vikky has taken on the awesome task of digitizing our oral history collection. Each history will be preserved on CD, and in a format that can be loaded to digital media players (including iPods and MP3 players) – making the stories readily accessible to fresh generations for years to come.


The Year of the Barn.

Congrat-us-lations! The San Juan Historical Museum will be awarded a \$25,000 grant this fiscal year from the Washington State Heritage Capital Project Fund, toward Phase II of the Barn Project. This award is a matching grant funding one-third of the budget for this next stage of the project; we have to raise the rest.

With this grant, the Museum will complete the second wing of our onsite barn, transforming this modest 1980s structure into a faithful replica of a working barn of the 19th century. When it's finished, the Barn will showcase our exhibits of large-scale farming implements, as well as displays illustrating the island's historical industries, the Jim Crook collection of textile equipment, and hands-on activities for children and families. Our timeline for completion is summer 2009.
